Value of being asked:

When you know what you need, you know what to **look** for.





Value of answering WHY volunteerism matters:

There is a proven correlation between **volunteering** and donating. One study (VolunteerMatch.org) found that on average, **volunteers donate** ten times more than non-**volunteers**.

In addition, nearly 70% of folks surveyed said they **donate** to the organization for which they **volunteer**.

Value of answering WHY volunteerism matters:

6 Health Benefits to Volunteering according to the Mayo Clinic:

- 1. Volunteering decreases depression
- 2. Volunteering gives a sense of purpose and increases skills
- 3. Volunteering keeps people mentally and physically active
- 4. Volunteering reduces stress
- 5. Volunteering may help you live longer
- 6. Volunteering helps you meet others and build relationships
